Gabe started his career in Rochester as a weekend anchor at WHEC-TV, and worked his way up to become the co-anchor on the weekday newscast at 6:00 and 11:00 pm. After 29 years as a news anchor with WHEC - the longest tenure in station history - Gabe retired from news casting on December 31, 2004 and joined his wife, Jean, at Dalmath Associates, a communications/marketing firm. He had a love for sports and kept very active all year round. When he wasn't skiing, wind surfing, playing tennis, or golfing he dedicated himself to the community in which he lived. He was passionate about improving the lives of those who are most vulnerable, particularly children, and he worked diligently to encourage others to get involved in volunteer activities.

In 1976, Gabe became the co-host for the local Muscular Dystrophy Association's Annual Telethon, a position he held longer than anyone else in the United States. When he was called into duty to help raise money for the MDA, Gabe knew he was making the right choice, knowing that he could make a difference in the lives of children. What he didn't know at the time, but came to love about the MDA, was that the children he helped would also have a profound impact on him. He also volunteered his time with Junior Achievement of Rochester, the Seneca Park Zoo, and many other community events and organizations. Gabe was also a dedicated family man, and made the most of every opportunity to spend time with his wife, Jean; his daughter, Amanda; and his parents, Kate and Andrew.

In 2003, when the Northwest Family YMCA was raising money to build YMCA Camp Northpoint, Gabe happily stepped up as Honorary Chair of our inaugural community walk. His support helped us to raise more than \$20,000 in our first Camp Northpoint Walk. He helped to get the community involved and excited about this new facility that has impacted many children and families. In 2007, we dedicated our Annual Camp Northpoint Walk in Gabe's Memory because of his dedication to making our community a better place to live, work and raise a family.
